TRAIN EXCURSION TO RAILFEST SATURDAY, JULY 7, 2007

The Harrisburg Chapter, National Railway Historical Society is on the move again with another excursion behind the Juniata Terminal/PRR E8A engines. If you wanted to ride behind these beautiful locomotives but couldn't afford the fare, this trip is for you. Plan to join us for an exciting train excursion from Harrisburg to Altoona, PA, plus a ride around the famous Horseshoe Curve, followed by an afternoon at Railfest and a return to Harrisburg by chartered motor coach. The excursion will feature coach seating on a train pulled by two immaculately-restored, vintage passenger diesel locomotives painted for the Pennsylvania Railroad.



Called the *Capitol Tripper*, the train will depart the Harrisburg Amtrak Station at 7:15 am. After a non-stop run to Altoona, where additional passengers will board the train will climb the Allegheny front, traversing majestic Horseshoe Curve en route. After tunneling under the crest at Gallitzin, the train will make a loop and return to Altoona for detraining all passengers at approximately 11:30 am. There is a convenient foot bridge to reach the Museum from the station, and a separate foot bridge provides an overhead vantage point for photographing through trains, helpers and the excursion train. Passengers will be on their own for the afternoon to participate in all the activities of Railfest—a celebration of Altoona railroad heritage. Your trip fare will pay for admission to Railfest, which includes the Railroaders Memorial Museum, live entertainment on the Museum stage, outdoor rolling stock, a new turntable, Museum grounds, a shuttle bus ride to visit the Horseshoe Curve and admission to the Curve. The Museum houses numerous exhibits and displays of the rich railroading tradition of Altoona and its citizens. There will also be a model train show, special exhibits and food and drink all day. The motor coaches (buses) will depart the Museum for Harrisburg promptly at 6:30 pm, arriving back about 9 pm.

The locomotives for the excursion are privately owned by the Juniata Terminal Company and are restored to their original colors and numbers. They were built in the 1950's and were last used by Conrail to power its executive train. The coach cars for the train are air-conditioned commuter cars from SEPTA and have a limited number of restrooms. There is no foodservice available on the train, but guests are welcome to bring their own food along

Fares for the entire trip are \$65 each. Included in the cost is the train fare to and around the Curve, admission to Railfest and the Museum, shuttle to the Curve, admission to the Curve and the return bus ride to Harrisburg. Tickets may be ordered from Railfest Trip, 2467 Little Buffalo Road, Newport, PA 17074-8822. Checks must accompany an order and should be made payable to "Harrisburg Chapter NRHS." PLEASE INCLUDE A STAMPED, SELF-ADDRESSED ENVELOPE FOR MAILING OF YOUR TICKETS, which will be done as soon as they are available. We would also appreciate an e/mail address for emergency use only. Details on parking in Harrisburg and a Railfest brochure will be mailed with your tickets. We hope you can join us for this opportunity to attend Railfest. Although it can't be promised, there is an outside possibility that the Museum's K4 steam locomotive #1361 may be returned to Altoona for the event. If there, it will likely not be under steam, but will be displayed in a prominent location for photography. Also new to the Museum this year is the ex-PRR observation car "Mountain View," veteran of service on the famous *Broadway Limited*.

We expect these seats to be sold quickly, so do not hesitate to order. Capacity is limited to two buses. Besides driving, this is one of the few attendance options that does not involve a two-day stay and yet allows a long-distance ride through the beautiful Juniata Valley. Plan now to join us.
